

We are a growing congregation of more than 160 members and almost 100 youth and children. We have a full-time, professional minister, a thriving religious education program, varied educational and social activities for adults and families, a committed social action program, and covenant groups that offer ministry in a more intimate setting. We are becoming known in this area as a voice for tolerance, respect, and social action. To make our presence known and our faith more available to others who might seek to

join us, last fall we moved our Sunday services to The Playhouse in downtown Winslow.

Where we stand

Five years ago the fellowship known by the acronym UUFBINK set out an ambitious list of goals to make its presence more visible to our wider community, and to make the good news of Unitarian Universalism more available to all who would seek us. As we succeeded in reaching each of those goals (and in some cases exceeding them), we set out once again in the fall of 2005 to envision our future by developing a Comprehensive Plan detailing how we plan to grow and serve our mission over the next five years. The development of our Comprehensive Plan involved many hours of hard work and dedication from across the congregation to bring our hopes and dreams into focus. With the adoption of the plan by the congregation last November, we set a bold course for the future.

The upcoming 2006-07 fiscal year marks the implementation of the first steps of our plan. The goals we have set for ourselves in this first year are highlighted on the facing page. In order to fund the staff, programs, and activities we need to support these goals, our financial plan estimates that we will need a total income of \$232,400 for next year. A substantial portion of this income will come from pledges from new members, our annual auction, and other fundraising efforts. With these other income sources taken into account, we have set a goal of \$177,000 for this year's Annual Campaign.

Our goals for 2006-07

Worship with open hearts

- Compensate our minister in accordance with the established Fair Compensation Guidelines of the Unitarian Universalist Association (UUA).
- Establish a reserve account to provide professional services during future sabbatical leave by both our minister and our Director of Religious Education (DRE).
- Reinvigorate and expand our choir and other music programs.

Nurture a learning spirit

- Compensate our DRE in accordance with the UUA's Fair Compensation Guidelines and increase the job from half-time to three-quarters time.
- Expand our religious education program into a Lifespan Faith Development program that reaches members of all ages.
- Create a larger and more varied youth program.

Serve justice with compassion

- Continue to grow our Alternative Gift Project.
- Expand our social action and social justice programs.
- Work toward UUA Green Sanctuary certification.

Love without judgment

- Expand our Member Development program for new and existing members alike.
- Revitalize our Welcoming Congregation program.
- Create more covenant groups.


Some things to thoughtfully consider

Our current Annual Operating budget is met through the generous giving of every one of us in this faith community. In addition to our own gifts, however, we have been receiving a subsidy from the UUA as part of the Extension Ministry program for the last several years. That subsidy ends in June.

Since each of us is in a different financial situation, each of us can give at a different level. That's why we're asking you to consider the UUA's suggested "Fair Share Giving Guide", printed on the next page, when you're thinking about your level of giving. How do you value what our church does in and for our world? How do you value what being a part of our church means to your life? What is it worth to you? When deciding how much to give, we ask that you search your heart and give what feels right to you. Consider taking steps up to higher levels on the chart immediately below.

When considering how much to give for annual stewardship, please remember that the funding of our annual Operating Budget is separate from the recently approved Capital Campaign. That said, our ability as a congregation to build and sustain a church building will be heavily dependent on the level of our annual giving. Indeed, achieving the goals outlined in our Comprehensive Plan will require not only that we increase our overall level of annual giving as a congregation, but also that we continue to add new members.

If you need to make a choice, please give to the Annual Campaign before contributing to the Capital Campaign. Whatever you do, please remember that all gifts are important and deeply appreciated.

How to make a gift

- During our Annual Campaign each spring, you will be asked to renew your financial commitment to the church by completing a Financial Commitment Card.
- A Visiting Steward will be contacting you to make an appointment. When you get together, you'll have a chance to talk about your hopes and dreams for our congregation. You'll also be asked to give your completed Financial Commitment Card to your Visiting Steward.
- When you join the church as a new member, the gift you make upon joining is for the remainder of our current year (our fiscal year runs from July to June). A special Financial Commitment Card is used for new members to account for the partial-year commitment.

 You may pay your gift monthly, quarterly, or annually. You may pay by credit card, check, stock, bond, mutual fund transfer, or cash. Automatic debit withdrawal is also available. Your Visiting Steward can help you with the details of making your gift.
